The University of Southern Mississippi (USM) is an R1 institution and one of only 43 institutions accredited in all four areas of the arts. Additionally holds the Carnegie Community Engaged designation. The institution hosts four academic colleges, a Graduate School, and Honors College. Enrollment numbers consistently represent 14,000+ students. USM prioritizes student success, excellence in teaching, research, and creative activities, community partnerships, and a culture of inclusion.
